## **AFF launches a Strategic Plan**

The African Forest Forum has set out a strategy in a document entitled 'African Forest Forum Strategy 2009 – 2014', that will guide its activities at least for the next five years.

The document is based on a strategy development workshop held by the Governing Council at its meeting in Kigali, Rwanda on October 29, 2008. It was subsequently subjected to review and commentary by members of AFF and selected individuals for an additional period of 3 months.

### Workshops tackle climate change, forests, wildlife

The AFF has implemented two workshops, one for eastern Africa on climate change and African forests and trees, and another on a pan-African level on climate change and African forest and wildlife resources. The objectives of the workshops were:

- Share lessons and experiences on how climate change features/manifests in African forests and wildlife areas.
- Develop a shared understanding of the challenges and opportunities related to climate change in the African forestry and wildlife sectors.
- Identify key issues/lessons of relevance to the forestry and wildlife sectors in Africa and way forward with them.

# African-Swedish forestry collaboration gets a boost

The African Forest Forum (AFF) and the Royal Swedish Academy of Agriculture and Forestry (KSLA) are collaborating on a project aiming at developing concrete and operational programme ideas on how experiences from successful management, use and conservation of forest resources in Sweden and elsewhere in the North might be initiated in Africa. To that end AFF and KSLA organised two workshops in Nairobi, Kenya, and Lusaka, Zambia in April 2010.

The signing ceremony took place at the AU headquarters in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. The MoU was signed by Prof Godwin Kowero, Executive Secretary of the African Forest Forum and Mrs. Rhoda Peace Tumusiime, Commissioner for Rural Economy and Agriculture of the African Union Commission.

## AFF assists Djibouti kick start the GGWSSI process

The Government of Djibouti solicited and obtained technical assistance from the African Forest Forum (AFF) to kick start activities under the Great Green Wall for the Sahel and the Sahara Initiative (GGWSSI). The initial activity was to conduct a baseline study in all the sites along the Great Green Wall band within the framework of implementation of the national component. This baseline study will give a broad view of the current situation of the sites and set up a database of sectoral information.

The expected results of this study are sectoral reports on the water resources, agrosylvo-pastoralism (forestry, agriculture and pastoralism), energy and the socio-economic aspects. These reports will be synthesized into a document that will be used as reference material in terms of characteristics, constraints and potentials of the sites as well as proposed actions. Also on the basis of these results, a project document will be elaborated for funding the implementation of the proposed actions.

This study is almost finished and a validation workshop will be organized very soon.

## **Governing Council meets in Nairobi**

The Governing Council (GC) of the African Forest Forum (AFF) held its sixth meeting on **April 14-15, 2010.** The Governing Council has met six times and the Executive Committee (EC) nine times since the AFF became operational in October 2007. In all these meetings several decisions were made to facilitate the work of the AFF. The key decisions from these meetings demonstrate progress made in the administration and management of the affairs of the AFF through the GC.
