

THE AFRICAN FOREST FORUM (AFF): Goal and programmatic approach

Goal

To provide independent analysis and advice to national, regional and international institutions and actors, on how economic, food security and environmental issues can be addressed through the sustainable management of forests and trees





The project

Strengthening management and use of forest ecosystems for sustainable development in Africa (AFF-Sida)

The overall goal: "to generate and share knowledge and information through partnerships in ways that provide inputs into policy and decision-making options and capacity building, for improved forest management that better addresses poverty eradication and environmental protection in Africa".



Specific objectives include:

- improving knowledge and capacities of African stakeholders in responding to adverse effects of climate change through better management and use of forest ecosystems and trees outside forests; and
- identifying and promoting opportunities for protecting and sustainably managing the forest resource base on the continent as well as the supply of its ecosystem goods and services



Contribution to project outcomes

- Outcome 1.2: Stakeholders, by gender, <u>capacitated</u> to use improved knowledge, skills and best practices to <u>contain loss of forest cover</u>
- Outcome 2.1: Better understanding cultivated on the relationship between a) climate change and forests and trees, b) climate change and forest-based ecosystem services
- Outcome 2.2: Better understanding of measures to increase the resilience to adverse effects of climate change on forests and tree resources and on people who depend on them, and disaggregated by gender







Background to the workshop

AFF facilitated research fellowships and experts' studies in different ecosystems (Sahel parklands, moist forests, mangroves, and woodlands) on:

- □ assessment of the impacts of climate change on forests, tree-resources, and associated ecosystem services, as well as coping mechanisms in selected African countries;
- □ assessment of gender responsive resilience of forest related biophysical and socio-economic systems to climate change impact in selected countries; and
- evaluation of the approaches, technologies, and other means to increase efficiency in the sawn timber value chains in different forest types in selected countries in Africa.
















Objectives of the workshop

Specific objectives

- provide a **forum for dialogue** to enhance collaboration and mechanisms of **sharing experiences** on processes, methods and tools on climate change adaptation and mitigation in forests and tree-based systems;
- promote and facilitate development of policies and strategies that could enhance adoption of forest-based climate change adaptation and increasing resilience for better socio-economic development;
- deliberate on findings from various studies undertaken on (i) climate change impacts and resilience measures, and (ii) efficiency of sawn timber value chains;
- collect information on capacity building needs and related suitable approaches to address various challenges in sustainable resources management.
