## Vision, Mission and Statistics

Vision: Attain prosperous, stable, competitive and Politically United East Africa

Mission: Widen and deepens economic, political, social and cultural integration in order to improve the quality of life of the people through increased competitiveness, value added production, trade and investments.

## EAC REGIONAL INTEGRATION PILLARS

#### **A HIGHLIGHT**

#### **CUSTOMS UNION**

#### 2005

Enabling the EAC Partner
States to enjoy economies of scale, with a view to supporting the process of economic development through the establishment of a Single Customs Territory.

#### **COMMON MARKET**

#### 2010

Accelerating economic growth and development while maintaining a liberal stance towards the **5** Freedoms of movement for all factors of production in the region.

#### **MONETARY UNION**

#### 2013

Laying the groundwork within a 10-year span, while allowing the EAC Partner States to progressively converge their currencies into a single currency in the Community.

#### **POLITICAL FEDERATION**

#### **ONGOING**

Putting in place initiatives to fast-track political integration.
In May 2017 EAC Heads of State adopted the Political
Confederation as a transitional model of the East African
Political Federation.



## Status of the forestry sector in the region

- On average, forests covers about 15.8% of the EAC land surface area.
- The major forest types include tropical and sub-tropical forests (montane and lowland forests), forest plantations, woodlands and mangroves.
- They provide goods and services vital for sustainable and inclusive socio-economic development

#### Main threats:

- Inadequate administration and governance of forest resources
- Inadequate coordination and collaboration in SFM leading to conflicting policies and practices.
- Unsustainable utilization and inadequate terms of trade terms
- Climate Change
- Social factors

- Forestry Protection and Conservation (Article 114-2a of the Treaty)
- Transboundary Ecosystem Management Bill 2015 (Article 112 of the Treaty)

## Vision and Mission of the EAC Forestry Policy

Vision: Well managed forest resources supporting people's livelihoods and contributing to EAC socio-economic development.

Mission: To effectively manage and utilize forest resources for improved ecological, social and economic development

**Goal:** To contribute to sustainable management, production, investment and trade of forest resources for improved environmental conservation and socioeconomic development.

## The Forestry Policy (2022)

- 1. Promote forest governance for environmental, social and economic development
- 2. Promote and support development and enforcement of harmonized forest policies, laws, regulations and standards on access, benefit sharing, use and trade of forest and tree resources
- 3. Support adoption of Landscape approach to enhance ecosystems and biodiversity conservation in accordance with regional and international standards.
- 4. Promote cost effective and innovative research that best responds to current and emerging issues of all key stakeholders involved in forestry

- 5. Promote access and sharing of forest education and research facilities and information
- 6. Promote development of efficient, competitive, innovative, value-added forest products and industry for local and international markets
- 7. Promote agroforestry for wood and food production, soil and water conservation, enhancement of environmental services and incomes of communities.
- 8. Promote cooperation and management of trans-boundary forest resources
- 9. Establish and support sustainable financing mechanism for forestry sector development

## **EAC Forestry Strategy (2022/23-2032/33)**

- 1. Strengthen forest governance and management
- 2. Enhance sustainable management of forests and tree resources for enhanced ecological, social and economic benefits
- 3. Enhance forest research, innovation, technology transfer and optimal use of forest facilities and information across the region
- 4. Promote efficient processing and value addition of forest products
  - 5. Enhance agroforestry for wood, food production, incomes, improved farm productivity, agro-biodiversity and other environmental services
  - 6. Strengthen sustainable use and management of transboundary forest resources
  - 7. Promote sustainable financing of the forestry sector



 Promote good governance principles and practices for social, environment al and economic development

- 1. Enhanced transparency, accountability and equity issues and rule of law in forest management
- 2. Clear structures that govern forestry sector established
- 3. Profile of forestry sector raised and recognized as a key contributor to GDP
- 4. Participatory Forest Management enhanced



Harmonize forest policies, laws, regulations guidelines implemented

- 1. Effective legal framework developed and implemented
- 2. Enforcement of conservation laws and regulations harmonized and evaluated periodically to assess performance
- 3. Forest laws and regulations of common interest to Partner States ratified
- 4. Strengthened forest law enforcement and governance in respective countries consistent with prevailing national laws, rules and regulations
- 5. Established standards on access, benefit sharing, use and trade of forest and tree resources among EAC Partner States
